About the FNLGR System Readiness Series

This series is designed to support system readiness through practical, interactive training sessions tailored to specific user groups.

The sessions provide guided exposure to the FNLGR system environment, draft user materials, and applied scenarios. The sessions also support validation of user workflows and identification of refinements prior to broader onboarding.

Participants will have the opportunity to work directly within the FNLGR environment and provide feedback to support final system readiness.

Overview of the FNLGR Environment

- Navigate the FNLGR portal and login screen
- Review the main dashboard and navigation menu
- Identify key modules: Map, Search, and User Profile
- Understand public user access levels: Open Access and Logged-In Public Access

Key Features Walkthrough

- Account creation and login
- Parcel and land interest search tools
- Document purchase and download
- Browsing the interactive map: layers, measure tools, and lot search



Applied Scenarios

- This session is designed for public users of the FNLGR portal and focuses on applied, scenario-based training to support familiarity with search, map, and parcel access workflows.

Scenario 1 – Account Creation

Scenario: You are a member of the public accessing the FNLGR for the first time and would like to create a free account.

- Step 1: Navigate to the FNLGR portal <https://fnportal-uat.test.fnlgr.ca/> and select “Create Account”
- Step 2: Enter your information and select your “role”, accept privacy waiver and select ‘Sign Up’
- Step 3: Enter password recovery questions
- Step 4: Verify email address
- Step 5: Log in with your new credentials and verify your dashboard access

Goal: Successfully create and activate a public user account in the FNLGR portal.

Scenario 2 – Conducting Searches

Scenario: You would like to search for land instruments, interests, and indexed documents, and purchase access to parcel information.

- Step 1: Using the sidebar menu, open the search page (you will see “Instruments”, “Interests”, and “Indexed Documents” at the top of the page – select the appropriate category for your search)
- Step 2: Enter the search criteria. Note: the default is set to search “Any First Nation” – if you wish to search for a specific First Nation, select from the drop down list
- Step 3: Review the search results
- Step 4: Access associated Parcel or Reserve details
- Step 5: Purchase full access to view parcel details, Parcel Abstract, and all interests and instruments associated with a particular parcel (use the demo credit card provided – do NOT enter personal credit card information)
- Step 6: Complete the payment

Training data: Nipissing First Nation

Goal: Successfully search, retrieve, and purchase parcel information in the FNLGR portal.

Scenario 3 – Browsing the Map

Scenario: You would like to explore the interactive map to find First Nation land parcels and use the map tools.

Key map features to explore:

- Search Bar: Find specific areas by entering a postal address, an Indian reserve name, or an NRCan PIN. Select a category from the dropdown list next to the search bar, then enter your search criteria.
- Layers Panel: Toggle map layers on or off and customize your view using the panel on the right side of the map
- Map Controls: Zoom in/out, zoom back/forward, Location, Identify, and Measure distance/area

Try it – Measure Distance:

- Step 1: Click the measure icon and select Measure Distance
- Step 2: Click the map at the location where you want to start measuring
- Step 3: Move the pointer to the next point on the map and click to add that point
- Step 4: Specify the end point by double-clicking on the map – the drawn line and its length will appear near the end point
- Step 5: To exit this mode, select Measure Distance again

Goal: Navigate the FNLGR map, use map tools, and locate First Nation land parcels and reserves.



Discussion and feedback

Reflect on the Scenarios

- Were the steps intuitive and easy to follow?
- Did you encounter any errors, unexpected behaviour, or unclear prompts?
- Were required fields and data formats clear?

System Readiness Feedback

- What works well in the current FNLGR workflow?
- What would you change or improve before go-live?

Your feedback directly informs final system refinements before broader onboarding.



Key Differences – FNLRS to FNLGR

- There is always a Parcel Abstract Report (PAR) for every parcel
- There will be fees for search & document retrieval
- There will be integrated mapping features and links to survey plans
- Account creation is quick and seamless
- Public user support and user guides available for FNLGR
- Modern user-friendly interface, highly accessible to all users
- Emphasis on user experience & data security
