LAB Proposal

In response to systemic challenges, the Lands Advisory Board is proposing to establish a new First Nation Survey Authority (FNSA).

Modelled after successful provincial bodies like BC's LTSA, the FNSA would work in tandem with the First Nation Land Governance Registry (FNLGR) to create a modern, integrated, and First Nation-led land system.

Purpose of the FNSA

- First Nations-led authority to approve land surveys
- Applies to Land Code and participating Self-Governing First Nations
- Supports self-determination and land development
- Integrates with FNLGR

Why Change is Needed

- Current delays from Surveyor General approval
- Poor alignment with First Nation timelines
- Increased costs and legal confusion
- Based on successful models (e.g., BC LTSA)

Vision, Mission & Key Benefits

Vision: Trusted, Nation-led survey authority

Mission: Modernize approvals, build capacity, enable development

Benefits:

- Faster approvals for housing/leasing
- Aligned survey & registry data
- Cost savings (~3 FTE federal surveyors)
- First Nation-specific standards
- Capacity-building with Association of Canada Lands Surveyors (ACLS)

Governance & Legal Framework

- Operates independently under LAB oversight
- Shared infrastructure with FNLGR
- Legal authority through:
 - Amendments to FA / FAFNLMA
 - Changes to Canada Lands Surveys Act
- Plans still recorded in CLSR

Next Steps

- 1. Finalize legal and regulatory path
- 2. Identify pilot First Nations
- 3. Formalize ACLS and federal partnerships
- 4. Expand training and capacity building
