LAND STATUS REPORT – Policy & Procedures

Policy

Land Status Report is a process to identify any encumbrances over a certain parcel of <FN> lands.

The purpose is to research, verify and compile information on **<FN>** lands for distribution to Natural Resources Canada, land surveyors, membership, clients and interested parties in order for them to determine land tenure, accessibility and feasibility of a land transaction.

The following Land Status Forms have been developed and approved to be used by **<FN>** Land Governance Office to process these requests:

- Land Status Report FORM
- Land Status Report LETTER

Procedures

Use the following process to review the Land Status Report Form:

PART ONE – identify legal description, ownership and registered encumbrances

- Identify if the parcel is registered in the First Nations Lands Registry (FNLRS), include a copy of the Parcel Abstract Report (PAR) and if the description does not refer to a recorded plan, a copy of the description and sketch referred to.
- Review the Reserve General Report in the FNLRS to identify any applicable instruments.
 Un-surveyed permits/easements for distribution of utilities reflected on the Reserve General are not considered encumbrances against individual parcels of reserve land. No need to list them by registration no. on the land status report but can be identified by a general statement in the comments.
- If the lands are community held land or not reserve, please indicate on this line and use the description that best identifies the lands. Attach a sketch if possible.
- Identify if there are any registered encumbrances, review the PAR and give the instrument number and name of the persons holding the registered interest. (i.e, rights-of-way, easements, mortgages, etc.)
- Review your records to identify if there are any unregistered interests that may affect the parcel, indicate any findings in the comments.

PART TWO – document proposed land transaction details or purpose of request

- Identify the details of the proposed transactions and what the purpose of the request is for
- Review your records to identify if there are any pending transactions such as a not yet registered lease, survey or an estate settlement that may affect the parcel, indicate any findings in the comments.

PART THREE – provide your contact information and signature

 Add Land Governance Office details, including who to contact for more information on the review.

Communication

Use the following process to complete the request:

- Complete Letter and attach copy of Land Status Report (include PAR, if requested)
- Copy for file
- Send to client
