### Enforcement

#### **First Nation law making authority**

- Exploring First Nation law similar to Alberta's "Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods Act"
- Authority to deal with properties where illegal activities occur

#### **Policing**

- Amend RCMP Act: authority to enforce First Nation laws
- LAB submission First Nation policing enforce FN laws as essential service

#### **Prosecutions**

Amend federal prosecutors law: authority to enforce First Nation laws (FA amendment)

#### Senate Private Member's Bill

LAB working with MKO – possible Senate Bill in 2023 to deal with RCMP and prosecutions

### Additions to Reserve

- LAB proposed ATR reforms beginning in 2017
- Federal Budget 2021 recognizes need to re-design ATR policy
- CIRNA Minister has said current ATR policy is "broken"
- 2022 AGM resolution explore First Nation led approach to ATR submissions & Commission to replace federal ATRs
- Proposed reforms are supported by FN fiscal institutions, NIEDB, and have been discussed with some AFN leadership
- The First Nations led approach to ATRs will take several years to build possibly after the next federal election in 2025





# Additions to Reserve – Short Term Pilot Project

- CIRNA "Call for Proposals" for this fiscal year potential funding for ATR reforms
- LAB will propose a pilot project with several land code First Nations
- LAB agreement with Canada pilot project to eliminate parts of ATR policy:
  - Eliminate requirement to negotiate municipal services before an ATR
  - Eliminate narrow categories limiting types of ATRs
  - Eliminate requirements for surveys before an ATR
  - Flexibility to acquire lands with known environmental issues
  - Eliminate 20 page ATR application form
- Canada would retain discretion to accept or reject proposed ATRs pilot First Nations to provide short, compelling submission to convince Canada
- Exploring option for ATRs where First Nations (rather than Canada) hold title to reserves
- First Nation title to reserves would still be 91(24) lands.....not fee simple ownership of allotments within the reserve
- First Nation title to reserve option requires an FA amendment





# Framework Agreement Amendments

- 2023 September AGM we hope to discuss amendments:
- New FN land registry provisions including authority for FN regulations
- ATR reforms
  - option for First Nation title to lands
  - Clarify authority for conditional ATRs
- LAB authority to deal with **minor** amendments (eg. re-numbering FA provisions, adjustments to track changes to federal laws etc....)
- Exploring amendments to streamline the developmental process





# Operational Funding

- Federal Budget 2023:
- the government reaffirms its commitment to negotiate a renewed operating funding formula with the Lands Advisory Board to ensure the continued growth and success of First Nation Land Management
- Canada will be providing a proposal back to the LAB on operational funding
- Timeframe unknown at this time





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
