Coordinating provincial communications


 Implementing regulatory restrictions on water use as necessary (Water Sustainability Act)

## **Drought Monitoring & Communications in B.C.**


Drought Classification					
Level	Conditions	Significance	Objective		
1 (Green)	Normal Conditions	There is sufficient water to meet human and ecosystem needs	Preparedness		
2 (Yellow)	Dry Conditions	First indications of a potential water supply problem	Voluntary conservation		
3 (Orange)	Very Dry Conditions	Potentially serious ecosystem or socio- economic impacts are possible	Voluntary conservation and restrictions		
4 (Red)	Extremely Dry Conditions	Water supply insufficient to meet socio-economic and ecosystem needs	Voluntary conservation, restrictions and regulatory action as necessary



## **Key Roles of Province: Flood Management**

- Monitoring, issuing streamflow advisories/flood watches/warnings
- Administering the Dike Maintenance Act and Dam Safety Program
- Guidelines: e.g., Land Use in Flood Hazard Areas
- Supporting local emergency preparedness & response
- Funding for flood mitigation projects (EMBC)



### Advisories, Flood Watches, and Flood Warnings

#### **High Streamflow Advisory**

•River levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but no major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.


#### **Flood Watch**

River levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull.
 Flood of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur

#### **Flood Warning**

 River levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently. Flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.






