NCN "Reserve Lands" within the RMA

- Existing reserve IR 170: 15,000 acres
- Settlement agreement lands: 65,000 acres
- Treaty Land Entitlement (TLE): 60,000 acres
- Mystery Lake Property: 4.2 acres
- Total: 140,000+ acres



Land Use Planning Includes:

- Policy Framework & Mapping to Guide Decision Making
- NCN Identity & Assertion Identifying culturally important sites, assertion of our occupancy, food security, water control
- Where can development occur? what are "no-go areas" no development
- NCN Indigenous Park Area(s) ex. Leftrook watershed, North RMA
- Collecting both traditional knowledge and computer-generated mapping for future use – Occupancy/Data sovereignty



LER Priorities/Functions

- Asserting NCN sovereignty, rights and titles to lands and resources
- Ensuring NCN data (such as maps, studies, surveys, interviews) remains NCN data
- Managing and monitoring lands and water
- Teaching the history of NCN people and local lands, waterways, resources
- Preserving our way of life
- Protecting our sacred and ceremonial sites, medicines, plants, species and habitats, waterways

- Mandate of Board is to develop land use plan and resource management plan(s)
- Review and monitor activities in RMA
- Research and development
- Consult with leadership and community on resource activities



Nelson House Fisherman's Association (NHFA)

Overview

- Provides employment opportunities
- Mitigates and subsidizes NCN fishers through 1996 NFA Implementation Agreement compensation
- Helps access Employment Insurance benefits between seasons
- Assists expansion into global markets (FWFMC??)
- Initiate Business Plan?



Country Foods Program Overview

- Provides food to Elders, low-income Citizens and those facing difficulties
- Supplies equipment, supplies and transportation expenses
- Helps with social, cultural and ceremonial activities
- Offers employment opportunities to high school and post-secondary students
- Maintains Leftrook Lake camping facilities
- Food security



Trappers Association Overview

- Manages fur subsidies
- Provides materials for cabin repairs for trap line lineage holder
- Offers start-up costs for groceries, equipment and gas (to be paid back)



- Offers loans to help trappers purchase snowmobiles, with terms
- Maintains bush and ice trails
- Teaches workshops for NCN Citizens

The NCN Land Guardians Program Overview – Stewardship

- Monitors Ketaskinow
- Observes & reports environmental concerns (water, land, species)
- Patrols areas of priority, noting history and current status – data collection/land use & Occupancy
- Promotes responsible management and restoration of lands and waterways
- Implement Plan(s)/Policies enforcement through education & awareness



The NCN Land Guardians Program cont'd.

- Revitalizes Cree place names
- Revitalize, Protects sacred & historic sites
- Reclaims culture, traditions & language
- Strengthens governance and nationhood over NCN lands and resources
- Implements NCN Land and Resource Plans, permitting/fees
- Promotes healthy land and water, and positive lifestyles



Priority Actions/Projects & Initiatives - Next Steps

Ketaskinow (Territorial) – Resource Based

- Approval & Implementation of territorial LUP
- NCN Mineral management strategy ("Resource Management Plan*")
- Indigenous parks initiative Leftrook Lake Watershed (ex. National park)
- ATR's and TLE/NFA add new lands owed
- Establish an NCN consultation unit to develop and implement a consultation process and policies – *"Tawinamakewin"*
- Treaty Land disparity claim potential \$100-300 million claim for land disparity with Treaty 5 provisions – NCN Received 25% of land all other # treaty(s) received (160 acres per family of 5 vs 640)
- Resource Corp Entity to facilitate own source revenues

- Land Management (Reserve Lands) – Reserve Land Based
- Community land use planning IR 170 Land Code
- Environmental management plan
- Waste management planning
- Land Law development, leasing, EMP, etc.
- Legal & administrative framework(s)
