Adhesion to the *Framework Agreement on First Nation Land Management* signed by First Nation and Canada

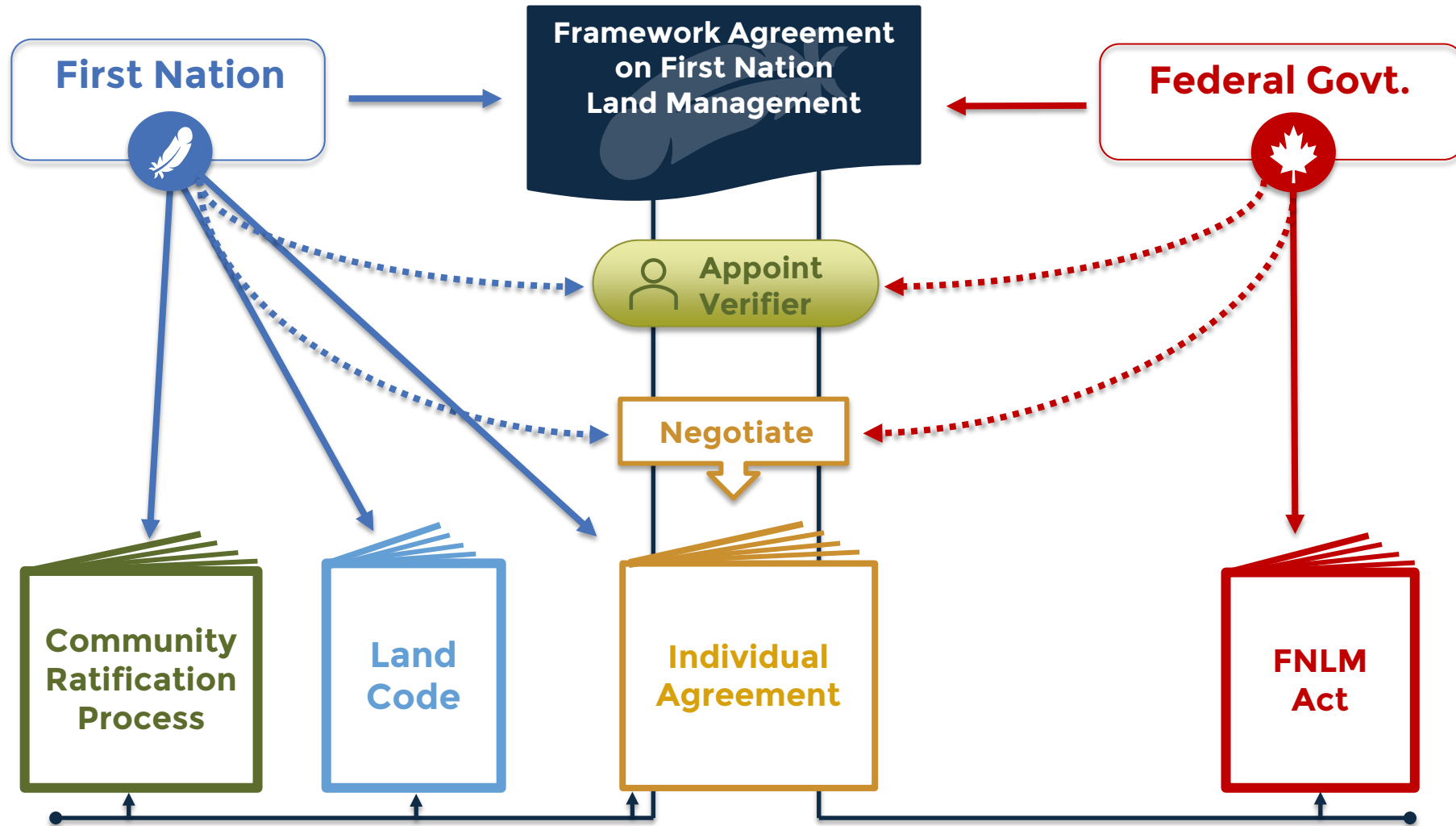


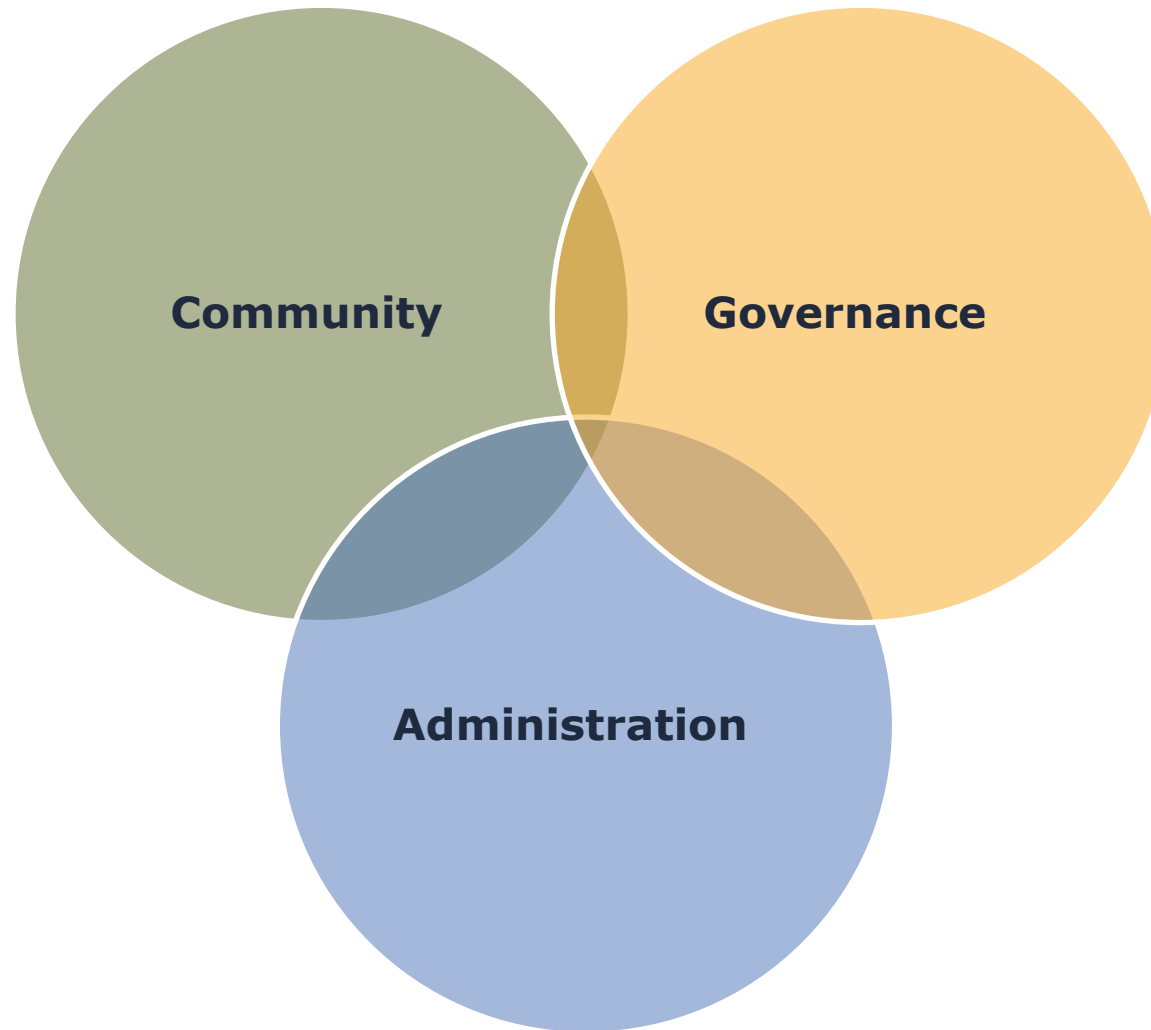

ROLES IN THE DEVELOPMENT PHASE



Elected political body comprised of 10 Board Members plus the Chairman. 3+ regions in Canada (Fraser Valley, BC, Prairies, East) supporting First Nations in accordance with the Framework Agreement.



Technical body established by the Lands Advisory Board, providing support for LAB activities, financial administration, and technical advice. Also provides support to developmental and operational First Nations in day-to-day operations.

VERIFIER

Independent person, recommended by LAB, and jointly appointed by the First Nation and Canada to monitor and confirm that the Community Ratification Process and Land Code are consistent with the Framework Agreement.



Indigenous Services Canada (ISC)

- Works with each First Nation to prepare the Individual Agreement for member approval
- Provides information about interests & licences that have been issued under the *Indian Act*
- Identifies amount of Revenue and Capital Monies for transfer to the FN
- Provides funding for the development and implementation a Land Code

Surveyor General Branch (SGB or NRCan)

- Conducts historical review from when a First Nation's reserve lands were created until today
- Confirms the exterior boundaries of a First Nation's reserve lands
- Prepares land description reports for inclusion to the Individual Agreement

ISC Environmental Specialists

- Supports a First Nation to conduct a Phase I Environmental Site Assessments for their reserve lands for inclusion in the Individual Agreement

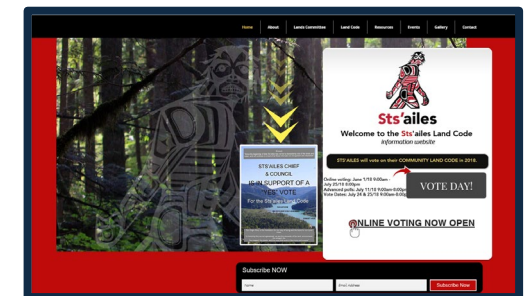
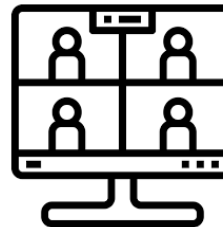

Support for the transition from Indian Act into to the Operational Phase

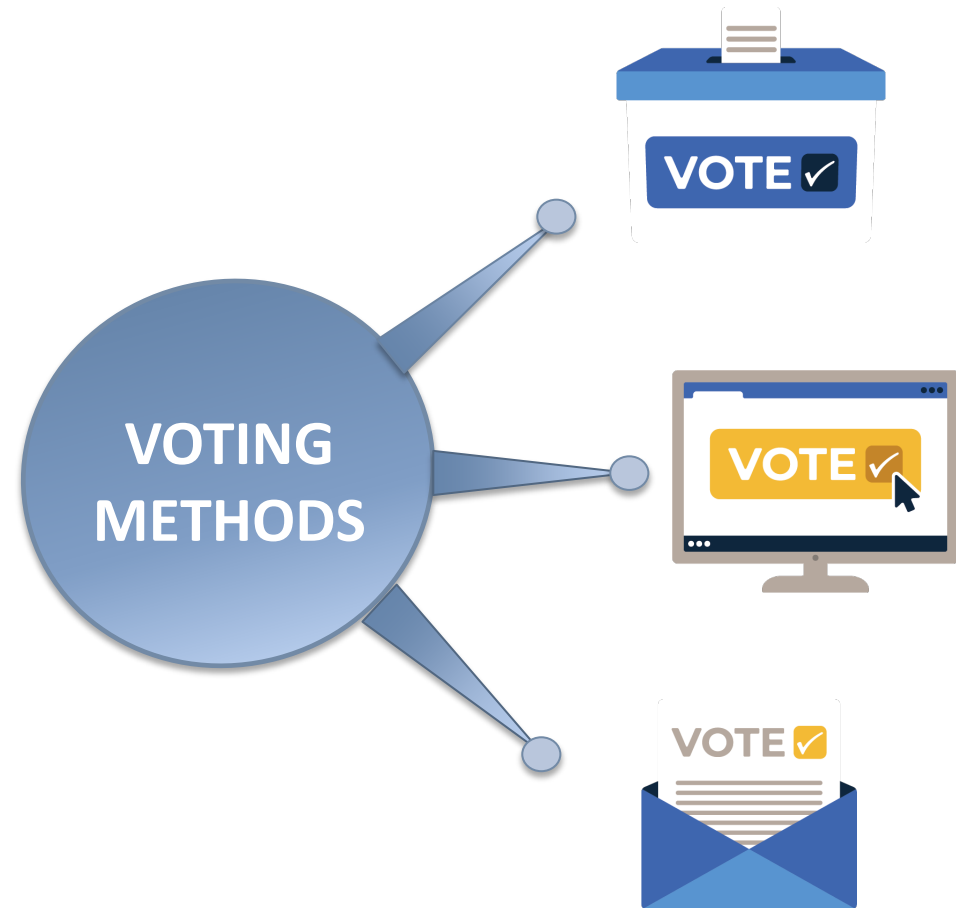

COMMUNITY RATIFICATION PROCESS

- Every eligible voter 18 yrs + as of last voting day must have the opportunity to freely vote
- Inclusive of on/off reserve voters
- In person polling stations, mail in ballots or electronic voting
- The community decides the voting methods and can also determine thresholds for approval and participation
