RC was established by the LAB to undertake its technical responsibilities to FNs, through:



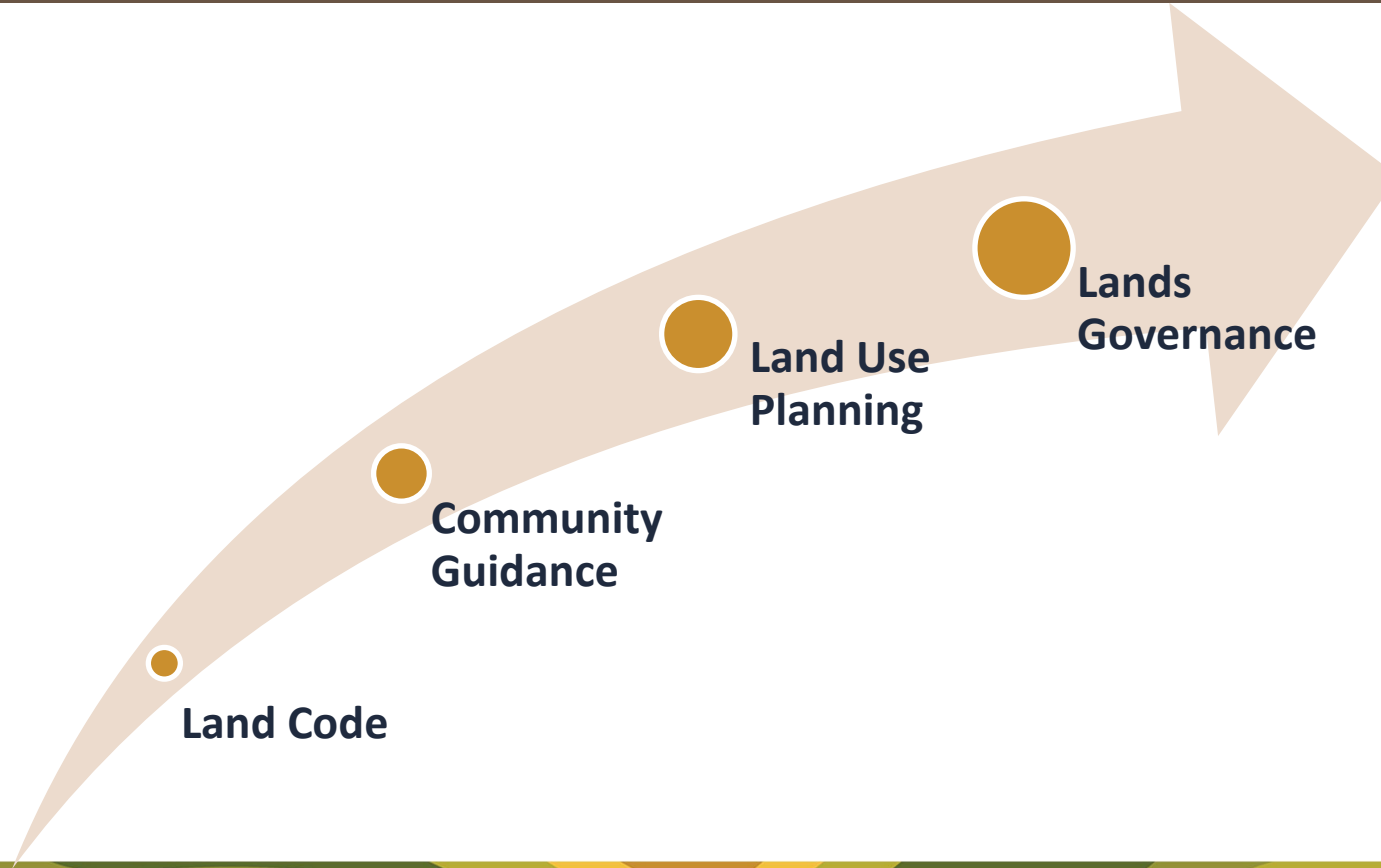

What is Land Use Planning under Land Code?

A community driven process rooted in the Land Code authority to help a First Nation governing body make decisions and plan for the future of your lands & resources.



Land:

- A Land Code authority applies to First Nation Reserve Lands (or “Lands Set Aside” in the Yukon)
- First Nations also plan for other types of land (fee-simple, ATR/TLE, Territorial or Aboriginal Title lands, etc.)
- Lands governance includes environmental issues, political issues, servicing issues and often go beyond reserve boundaries. As such reserve-based LUP's under a Land Code often look beyond reserve boundaries.

Use:

- Land-uses typically refers to residential, commercial, industrial, traditional uses, natural areas, etc.
- Different land-uses have unique impacts on the land and different planning considerations.
- Important to understand Community's current relationship to the land as well as this relationship in the past.
- “Land Use Planning” is largely a recognized term for First Nations operating under Land Code. It is an important and useful term as people typically understand what it means.
- Where possible, we encourage First Nations to use a community-specific approach to lands planning. For example, the RC can provide support towards the use of traditional language and concepts in your Community's planning processes which support the decolonization of lands governance.

Planning:

- First Nations using their Land Code authority to prepare for the future and respond to land-management issues.
- Identifying a community Vision and moving forward collectively to achieve that Vision
- Engaging and empowering community members to be part of Lands Governance decision-making
- Using community identified values and principles to guide decision-making by a First Nation

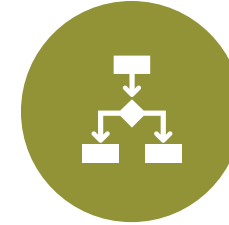

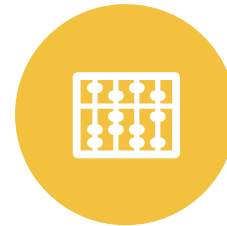

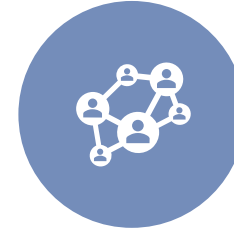

Land Use Plan Funding

Purpose:

- Support the creation of Land Use Plans for First Nations operating with a Land Code

Funding priorities:

- Operational First Nations with no Land Use Plan
- Operational First Nations with an old or outdated Land Use Plan
- In rare cases, developmental communities transitioning away from the *Indian Act*

Over \$4 million in approved funding for over 40 First Nation Land Use Plans!

- 2018/19 – 12 projects approved, \$1,090,000 allocated funding
- 2019/20 – 20 projects approved, \$1,784,187 allocated funding
- 2020/21 – 11 projects approved, \$1,240,250 allocated funding
- 2021/22 – call-out for Expressions of Interests will be issued soon!

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lack of support from Leadership	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Workshop with Chief & Council on why LUP matters, the role of leadership in planning under Land Code
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Multiple plans and no formal planning structure	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Support in formulating your community's planning structure, how Land Use Plans relate to other plans (e.g. EMP, CCP)
